

National Institute for International Education

is a national institute under the Ministry of Education established to exchange and to cooperate on international education of overseas Koreans.

It administers the planning, selection, management, and evaluation of domestic education programs of overseas Koreans.



Kongju National University

is a university that fosters secondary school teachers.
The University established the Institution of Korean Culture & Education specializing in the education of overseas Koreans.
The Institution is in charge of operating (classes and students) domestic education programs for overseas Koreans.

What is the Korean education program for overseas Koreans?

'Korean Homeland Education (K-HED)' is an education program for overseas Koreans made to cultivate the ethnic identity of overseas Koreans and help next-generation overseas Koreans to grow into global talents. This program comprises the Korean language, Korean culture, and Korean history classes, as well as field learning. K-HED is the only long-term education program for overseas Koreans in the nation that provides career guidance and a network of overseas Koreans.

Scholarship of National Institute for International Education





Targets: Overseas Koreans who applied for a domestic education program for overseas Koreans and was recommended by a diplomatic office

Selection criteria: Deliberated and selected by the 'Scholarship Committee' based on intent, potential for development, family background, and descendant of an independence patriot

Financing: The tuition fee for the program (one course) and 70% of the round-trip air fare

Number of beneficiaries: 310 persons per year

** In the case of a descendant of an independence patriot, the scholarship finances the tuition fee for the program (one course) and 100% of the round-trip air fare
